

'Eco-Metric' tool under development

Defra (Department for Environment Food and Rural Affairs) and Natural England are working with a consortium led by the University of Oxford to develop the 'eco-metric', which aims to measure the ability of habitats to deliver ecosystem services. It can be used to measure the net change in natural capital and the ecosystem services it provides as a result of land-use change or development. [More detail.](#)



Department for Environment Food and Rural Affairs launched consultation

Aiming to deliver on aspects of the 25 Year Environment Plan, the consultation covers: the objectives of net gain policy, the core concepts of biodiversity net gain and environmental net gain, and whether to make biodiversity net gain a requirement for development planning permission. Evidence received through this consultation will be considered for delivering biodiversity net gain successfully, and achieving the most for the environment and built developments.

We Value Nature was launched at the natural capital week in Paris and will be supported over the next three years by €2 million in funding from the European Commission. The ambition of this collaborative campaign is to help increase the use of approaches such as natural capital and green infrastructure assessment, natural capital accounting, nature based solutions and related ecosystem-based ways of working in businesses across Europe. 
ONS green cities tool: results from Welsh pilot studies



Cardiff "marginally greener" than Newport

The project aim is to make use of new data sources and data science techniques to better understand the environment and its value. The tool itself, which examines the volume of visible roadside trees and hedges, has produced street-level scores for urban greenery. A UK-wide rollout is planned. Citizen science deployed to review UK urban canopy cover

Trees for Cities, Brillianto and Forest Research are hosting a citizen science project to map out the canopy cover of Britain's urban areas. Building up from an existing database covering 283 English towns and cities this project aims to expand across the UK.
